Spiritual formation

Educational objectives

Establish a comprehensive English Medium
All students should be bilingual, literate in English and study a third language
All students should be computer literate; this implies general computer education for all
Parental participation
Participation by teachers
Participation by Old Boys
Career guidance programme for all Catholic schools
Introduce Business Studies as a subject and prepare them to become entrepreneurial
Consider providing classes for students wishing to qualify in the University of London O-level and A-level examinations
Consider introducing afternoon classes as needed

Sports The goal here shall be to elevate existing standards. Inputs and plans will be sought from Sports Development Councils on the future projection of sports and standards, identifying the sports facilities available
All pupils will be encouraged to participate in sports and to develop values of sportsmanship.

Looking Back..

I received First Holy Communion in December 1950 while being a second standard student at St. Josph's. Rev. Fr. Fortin Vicar General of Colombo was the Celebrant of the Holy Mass.

Subsequently on the day before the first friday of each month we had to confess our sins. During those days we had a string of sins that we repeated to the confessor. I was from a family where we mainly spoke in Sinhalese. Thus my first utterance to the confessor was, "Father shall I tell my sins in Sinhalese." "Yes son" was the quick response. Once when I mentioned my medium of speech, the confessor said, " Son try to tell your sins in English". Without much difficulty I recited my string of sins in English. The Confessor declared "Son you can speak in English, have confidence".

Later I came to know that the priest was Rev. Fr. Tissa Balasuriya O.M.I. a great educationist and Theologian. He was the founder of the Centre for Society and Religion. 85 year old Fr. Balasuriya is presently at the CSR at Deanss Road Colombo 10. (MJCP)

Fairlie Dalpathado dies aged 85

Fairlie Dalpathado, a successful allrounder for St Joseph 's College and Ceylon , as it was then known, has died at the age of 85 at his residence in Kirillapone. He was buried according to his wishes within 24 hours by his family.

As a player, Dalpathado excelled for his alma mater and later for Sinhalese Sports Club and then All-Ceylon (as Sri Lanka was then known as). He dominated in a post-war era where cricketers of his caliber were hard to come by. Dalpathado is best remembered for leading the unbeaten St Joseph 's side against a Combined Schools team led by Vernon Prins of St Thomas', which included eight captains and nine centurions, in 1943. In this historic encounter Dalpathado contributed 59 with the bat and then bundled out the strong Combined Schools side for a mere 35, capturing 6 for 17 with his right-arm fast-medium deliveries. However, the organizers refused permission for St Joseph's to enforce the follow-on fearing an early finish to the match before the chief guest Governor of Ceylon Sir Jeffery Layton arrived.

Dalpathado moved to SSC to display his all-round skills and in 1949 made his debut for Ceylon under the captaincy of Derrick de Saram against a West Indian side led by John Goddard. He also represented his country under the leadership of Malcolm Spittel against Freddie Brown's Englishmen and toured Pakistan with the Ceylon team led by Sargo Jayawickrama in the 1950s. He was at the time regarded as the leading allrounder in Sri Lanka .

Even at the age of 60 he showed that he had not lost any of his touch as a bowler when he took eight wickets for Chilaw Marians (he was born in Chilaw) against Wattala Antonians in a division III cricket match. Dalpathado turned to coaching to pass on his valuable experience to future St Joseph 's players. He coached his school on three different occasions - in 1949 for a year, from 1965-73 and from 1975-88 during which period St Joseph's won the traditional 'Big Match' against St Peter's twice in 1982 and 1987..

During his 20-year tenure as coach, Dalpathado produced four champion sides and five outstanding captains in Rohan Weerakkody, Ashley de Silva, Nirmalal Perera, Jeevaka Candappa and Jonathan Alles.

Dalpathado also excelled at tennis taught him by his father. He worked at the Tea Control Department and retired at Tea Small Holdings as assistant manager. He is survived by his Indian-born wife Therese Abraham whom he met during one of his tennis tournaments to India and son and two daughters.

Vaas Leads Angelo and Thisara Follows

Josephians continue to provide Sri Lanka Cricket with pacies and allrounders. The trend initiated by Chaminda Vass is carried on through Angelo Mathews and Thisara Perera. Thisara is from Kotugoda Ja-Ela.

Chaminda Vass is in the company of the elite Test Cricketers who obtained the double of 3000 test runs and 300 test wickets. Chaminda joined Sir Ian Botham, Imran Khan, Sir Richard Hadlee, Kapil Dev, Shane Warne, Shaun Pollock, and Daniel Vettori in acheiving this unique feat.

SENIOR DEP FAMILY AND ST.JOSEPH'S COLLEGE

Lambert Dep and his wife Celestina Margraet Perera from Averiwatte Road Wattala, were the parents of ten children. All their sons were distinguished Josephians.

Thomas (Tom) Dep was the eldest in the family, who had his schooling at St. Joseph's where he represented the College at cricket. Subsequently he coached the Josephian cricket team as well. He became a Major of the Ceylon Army.

Arthur Dep was an outstanding allround athlete of College being an excellent hurdler and a pole vaulter. He was was the famous Pole Vaulting Champion who held the All Ceylon record for a period of 23 years.He joined the Police Department and retired as the Deputy Inspector General of Police. Vincent Dep was a Company Sergeant Major and later became Regimental Sergeant Major of the Cadet Corp.He became the the champion bantam weight wrestler in 1942. Vincent was ordained a priest in 1948 and celebrated his first Holy Mass at St. Joseph's chapel on the College Feast Day.He was appointed as the chaplain of the Ceylon Army. Presently 92 year old Fr. Vincent is in charge of Rotary Boys' Home at Irabadagama Sandalankawa.

George Dep was a renowned wrestler. An outstanding gymnast, he was the Josephian master in charge of gymnastics in nineteen fities and sixties. Presently he is domiciled in Australia.

Lucian was the youngest of the Deps to join College. He represented College at cricket and athletics Lucian held the Public Schools Pole Vault record for a record forty one years. Ironically he was the coach of the schoolboy who broke his record.

Lucian was the Captain-elect of the 1950 cricket team.However he had a choice of either captaining college at cricket or entering the seminary to become a priest of God. He knew that every choice was a sacrifice.With the Rector Rev. Fr. Peter Pillai to guide him, he sacrificed the glory of captaining the Josephian cricket team and joined St. Bernard's Seminary in order to serve in the Lord's Vineyard. While in the seminary in addition to his ecclesiastical studies he showed his talents as an accomplished gymnast.

After his ordination as a priest he was in the College tutorial staff on three different occasions. Fr. Lucian was an authority on the interpretation of the Holy Gospels. He has continued to be involved with college activities. Presently seventy six year old Fr. Lucian is at the "Evening Star" Havelock Town, Colombo.
